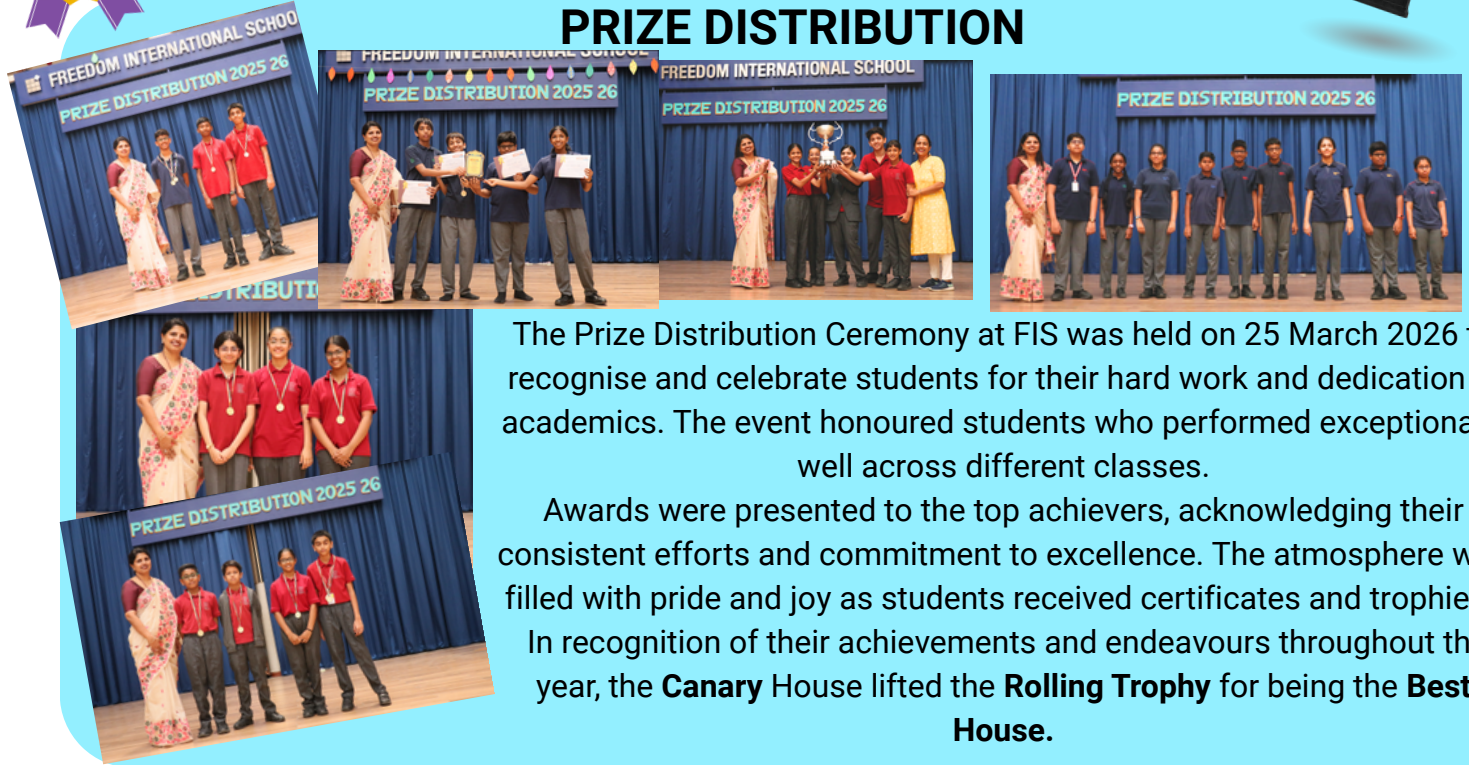

PROJECT DAY GRADE 1 AND 2

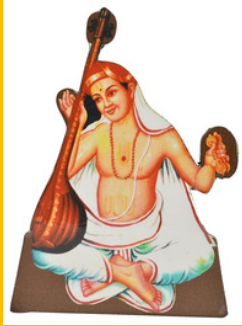
